Speech & Debate Team

The UF Speech and Debate Team is a student organization that encourages the healthy exchange of ideas through public speaking and argumentation.

Through competitions and workshops, members are able to enhance their research, presentation, and argumentation skills.

This organization is open to all students.



Competitive Speech

This nationally recognized speech team competes in original oratory, oral interpretation, and limited preparation speaking events that emphasize both argumentation and excellent delivery skills. The Speech Squad competes in both online and in person platforms with aspirations to take part in the regional and national championships. Through research, character development, and speech construction and writing, students learn about how to form an argument through oration and performance.

Auditions are required.

Public Debate

Public debate is a group that allows students to learn about argumentation and debate and develop their skills in oral communication. In addition, they create and plan public events on campus each semester. This squad welcomes all students who are interested in learning more about speech and debate as a whole, and there is **no formal process for joining**.

Competitive Debate

This nationally recognized debate team competes in International Public Debate (IPDA), a one on one debate format where debaters alternate between refuting and defending various resolutions in an extemporaneous speaking style. The Debate Squad competes in both online and in person platforms with aspirations to take part in the regional and national championships. Through research and competition, the debaters learn about international relations, politics, critical theory, and their intersections.




