## **COMMUNICATION STUDIES MINOR - CMS**

Hours: 18 credits, completed with minimum grades of C and no courses can be taken S-U (pass-fail.)

## **SECTION 1: CORE COURSES**

Take two of the three core courses:

- COM1000 Intro to Comm Studies 3 credits (online)
- SPC2300 Intro to Interpersonal Comm 3 credits
- SPC2608 Intro to Public Speaking 3 credits

## SECTION 2: UPPER-DIVISION COURSES

A minimum of 9 hours are required at the 3000 level or higher with the prefixes SPC or COM within the Dial Center.

Upper-division Dial Center courses include:

- $\circ$  COM4022 Health Comm
- COM4930 Special Topics (Students can take multiple sections of COM4930 to complete minor)
- SPC3331 Nonverbal Comm
- SPC3513 Argumentation
- SPC3602 Advanced Public Speaking
- SPC4425 Small Group Comm
- SPC4710 Intercultural Comm
- SPC4905 Individual Study

*Note:* SPC3605 and SPC4680 offered through the English Department at UF do NOT count toward the SCH minor.

## SECTION 3: ADDITIONAL 3-CREDIT COURSE

Any SPC or COM, upper- or lower-division course within the Dial Center. SPC2351 and SPC2594 count toward this part of the requirement.

*Note: Dial Center courses LIS2001 and ENC3254 do NOT count toward an SCH minor.* 

Effective communication skills at the personal and professional levels are essential prerequisites for success in today's world. The minor in communication studies provides an interdisciplinary forum for the study of communication and the opportunity for students to add indispensable tools to their educational program.

The minor requires a 2.5 minimum GPA for admission. Students must complete a minimum of six credits of coursework exclusive to the minor that cannot count toward the major(s) or other minors.

No more than three credits of SPC 4905 Independent Study, SPC 2594 Intercollegiate Forensics (prerequisite required) or RTV 3405 Television and American Society may substitute for a 3000-level course.
